

Advice to Nasrallah in Lebanon today: “Stop the counting”

Monitoring the “Forces” website team

Five days after the events of Tayouneh, and one was wanted by Hezbollah, “the accusation of the Lebanese Forces Party” the only impregnable fortress in the face of the “party” project and Iran’s ambitions.

Whoever asks for the head of the “forces” must realize that they are incapable of uprooting, and he must ask his masters in the Levant and Tehran about the history of the “forces” struggle and resistance in the face of the occupations that passed on Lebanon, with the quality of their many, not as the Secretary-General of Hezbollah, Hassan Nasrallah, boasted in his speech on the night Yesterday, Monday, the number of its elements was one hundred thousand. Accordingly, veteran sources give him advice to “stop the count,” because the “forces” and with them millions of free people, residents and expatriates, aim to build an independent sovereign state, not fake fronts, and they do not want to demolish the country, but rather demolish the temple on the heads of the corrupt and those who cover them.

It seems that Nasrallah sensed the resentment within his environment, which has taken an upward curve since the Joya incident, passing through Khaldeh, all the way to Tayouneh.

Nasrallah continued his attack on the judicial investigator, Judge Tariq Bitar, and insisted that he step down, but Nasrallah’s dream appears to be difficult to achieve until now, as the head of the “Justicia” Foundation, lawyer Dr. Paul Morcos, confirms, to the Lebanese Forces website, that he “no longer has the executive authority. That is, the government and the Minister of Justice, and even the Supreme Judicial Council as a judicial administration, have any authority with the judicial investigator regarding the basis of his work, except for rare and narrow cases that require referring him to judicial inspection.”

Morcos points out, “Although there is a rule (parallelism with formulas), meaning that whoever issued the appointment and referral decision can withdraw them or withdraw them, but it does not apply here as long as the judicial investigator puts his hand on the saisine file. Therefore, the exits for the removal of the judge or his dismissal are in the courts.”

And he points out, that “as long as the competent courts have not pronounced any decision in the direction of disqualification or dismissal of the judge or transfer of the case, or other matters that mean that the current judicial investigator does not remain in charge of the file, he remains the master of his file, and therefore continues to work as if nothing had happened.” . Internationally, Al-Hurra channel quoted the Chairman of the US Senate Foreign Relations Committee, Bob Menendez, and its member, Jim Risch, as expressing their concern about “Hezbollah’s role in obstructing the decisive investigation into the devastating explosion in Beirut Port. They pointed out that “Judicial Investigator Tariq Al-Bitar is a respected and fair man of law by all standards, and has more than 10 years of service as a judge in his country.”

The two officials considered that “it is the duty of the Lebanese government to ensure the right of judges and other investigators to safely perform their duties and complete this investigation,”

stressing that “the Lebanese, many of whom are still suffering from the material and economic effects of the port explosion, deserve to hold those responsible for this tragedy accountable.”

With regard to the investigations into the Tayouneh events, the winds were the opposite of what Hezbollah desired, as attention is directed during the next two days to closing the file of the military and security investigations into the events of the Tayouneh clashes and referring it with the detainees pending investigation to the court, amid preliminary information about the results of these investigations. Documented refutes the narrative of the “Shiite couple” in the demonstrators being ambushed and sniped.

This was confirmed by the Minister of Defense himself, saying that “what happened on Thursday was not an ambush, but rather an ominous incident, and that there is a possibility of shooting from the street and not from the rooftops,” noting at the same time that the movement of “Hezbollah” and “Harakat” protesters Amal” faced a “sudden deviation to some side streets (in Ain al-Remmaneh) and this led to clashes,” according to “Nidaa al-Watan.”

In parallel, there are no signs of the government resuming its work, as Prime Minister Najib Mikati confirmed that he will not “definitely” call for a cabinet session “if this (Shiite duo) component is not participating, even if the ministerial majority is available, and it is not possible for me to provoke my partner in Citizenship.

He added to “An-Nahar”, “What I say expresses my conscience and my national convictions.” He stressed that “the government is staying and continuing at all levels, starting with the International Monetary Fund plus the electricity plan in order to reduce rationing and increase the hours of electricity. Citizens will touch this matter before the end of the current year, “and no one will paralyze us in the face of all these files that we are dealing with.”

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
